Transition Bags

Fall Community Service Project

At our November 12 meeting we will be collecting "Transition Bags" for the Norma Herr Cleveland Women's Shelter. These gift bags are given to shelter residents as they move out into independent housing. Here is a list of items which should be included in each bag. Ask your group members to make donations. Guidelines have changed so that donated towels and linens can be either new or gently-used (no holes or big stains).

If you are unable to create a complete basket the shelter can still use any items from the list you are able to collect.

Members of the Community Service Committee will be in the Parking Lot of AHA before the November Meeting to collect your donations.

1. Duffle Bag or Tote Bag (place items in this).
2. Laundry detergent
3. Fabric softener
4. One set of towels (one each: bath towel, hand towel, washcloth)
5. bar of soap
6. Hand lotion
7. Box of tissues
8. Two rolls of toilet tissue
9. Toothbrush and toothpaste
10. Sanitary napkins
11. Deodorant
12. Shampoo
13. Roll of paper towels
14. Multi-purpose cleaner
15. Sponge
16. Dishwashing soap

Here are some other items the shelter can use : any cleaning product, brooms and mops, twin size bed linens (new or gently used), pots, pans and kitchen supplies (can be used) and diapers.

Also most clients move into unfurnished apartments without a bed, so any air mattress or foam mattress to keep them from sleeping on the hard floor is also appreciated.

Sigma Kappa Sister Crowned Miss America 2014

Miss New York, Nina Davuluri, was crowned Miss America 2014 Sunday, September 15 in Atlantic City's Boardwalk Hall. Nina became the second consecutive contestant from New York and the first contestant of Indian descent to win the Miss America Competition.

Nina was initiated into Sigma Kappa Sorority at Michigan State University, Alpha Tau Chapter, and later transferred to the University of Michigan, Alpha Mu Chapter, where she graduated. During her year as Miss America she will serve as spokesperson for STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) as she travels to Washington, DC to work with the Department of Education. Along with the coveted title of Miss America 2014, Nina won a \$50,000 scholarship to continue her education. For the talent portion of the competition, Nina performed a Classical Bollywood Fusion dance.

Nina's acceptance of the highly-prized crown is just the beginning of a journey that will take her to every corner of the nation during her year of service as Miss America 2014. She will travel approximately 20,000 miles each month speaking to audiences about her platform, Celebrating Diversity through Cultural Competency and acting as the official National Goodwill Ambassador for Children's Miracle Network Hospitals.

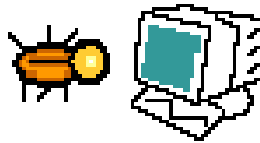
