The disappointing news is that we got turned down for the College Fair at Lakeland Community College since only colleges and universities are invited. Should anything else materialize, we will let everyone know.

We will be doing baskets for auction again at the Spring Scholarship Luncheon which is set for Saturday, May 16, 2015, at Executive Caterers at Landerhaven. The Ways and Means Committee will also be planning a Dine-Out and a brand new project, the sale of mixed-use, reusable bags. I am particularly pleased about this new project, especially since our environment is suffering greatly from throw-away, plastic grocery bags. California just banned them, as have the cities of Chicago, Austin and Seattle. Other countries have taxed or banned them. According to the EPA, some 500 billion to a trillion plastic bags are consumed worldwide each year, but less than 1% are recycled. It costs \$4,000 to process and recycle one ton of plastic bags

which then can be sold on the commodities market for only \$32. Reducing the use of plastic bags can help reduce our dependence on foreign oil. The real tragedy of plastic bags is that they end up in our oceans where they choke, strangle and starve wildlife, according to David Barnes, a marine scientist.



So I hope we all embrace this new project to sell these mixed-use, reusable bags.
