Jordan CRC gives women chance to break free from human trafficking, opioid addiction

Founded in Cleveland 15 years ago, Jordan Community Resource Center (CRC) helps survivors of dire life situations develop hope and start a new life. "It's named for the Jordan River," Executive Director Tenisha Gant-Watson explains during a presentation to the Cleveland Alumnae Panhellenic Association at the October delegate meeting. It comes from the Bible, she adds," where you have to cross the river to the promised land."

Jordan provides a safe, stable environment for women, by women with whom they can identify. It's a place to heal. Jordan CRC incorporates comprehensive substance abuse treatment along with spiritual support and trauma recovery services.

CAPA delegates and their groups are invited to contribute items from Jordan's Wish List (on next page). Please bring your donations to the November 12 meeting. The items must be NEW. They include small personal items that the women who reside at Jordan's facilities could use while they are there and larger items to make the stay more comfortable.

NPC News: A New Journey for NPC

On July 1, the National Panhellenic Conference transitioned to a <u>new organizational and governance structure</u> designed to make the Conference more nimble and responsive to the most pressing challenges facing students, campus partners and the greater Panhellenic community. The new structure includes a seven-member Board of Directors with an elected chairman, a Council of Delegates with one delegate from each

of NPC's 26 member organizations, many opportunities for NPC committee and volunteer service and an enhanced staff.

The NPC Board of Directors consists of five members elected to service by the Council of Delegates and two directors appointed by their member organization on a rotational basis. The directors lead NPC and have authority and responsibility for overseeing the affairs of the Conference by establishing corporate policy, setting the strategic direction, overseeing and securing resources and monitoring organizational performance. The Council of Delegates elects the NPC chairman.

The NPC Chief Executive Officer. Dani Weatherford, serves on the NPC Board of Directors as corporate secretary with a voice but no vote. This historic change in governance will equip NPC to be a stronger, more strategic ally to our campus-based colleagues on topics such as changing demographics, college affordability, different educational experiences that impact our organizations and the relevancy of lifetime membership when more and more of our members are looking for a transactional experience. As Panhellenic communities continue to look to NPC as a resource and a convener, this new organizational structure reflects our desire to further expand our capacity to serve such a role.

An important component of the new structure is the addition of the chief Panhellenic officer (CPO) for each member organization. The CPO now is the primary member organization contact for NPC and the 26 member organizations for campus issues and directs all incoming and outgoing communication regarding chapter and alumnae issues specifically as it relates to College and Alumnae Panhellenics.

As we embark on this new journey in NPC, staff and volunteers will partner together to accomplish their work ensuring that greater resources and staff-level engagement will focus on

priorities ranging from recruitment and membership growth, enhanced data collection and communication efforts advocating for the sorority experience.

Recipe Corner PORTILLO'S CHOPPED SALAD

The delicious salad Wendy Stummer brought to our October meeting YIELD: Party Size INGREDIENTS:

- 1 head each of Iceberg lettuce and Romaine lettuce
- 1 small bag shredded red cabbage
- 1 small red onion, finely chopped
- 1 bunch green onions, thinly sliced
- 1 small head cauliflower
- 1 cucumber, peeled and seeded
- 3 tomatoes, seeded and diced (optional)
- 1 lb. box ditalini pasta, cooked according to directions, drained and cooled
- 8 oz. gorgonzola cheese, crumbled
- 1 lb. bacon, cooked and crumbled
- 1-2 jars Marzetti Sweet Italian Dressing
- 2 c. cooked and diced chicken breasts
 - Wash and dry lettuces. Chop lettuces into small pieces. Place in a large bowl.
 - Chop remaining ingredients to similar size as ditalini. Add remaining ingredients to bowl except bacon.
 - Just before serving, add salad dressing and bacon. Toss well.

GREEN GODDESS DRESSING

From the CAPA Summer Picnic INGREDIENTS

- ■½ cup mayonnaise
- ■1/3 cup buttermilk
- ■¼ cup chopped fresh chives
- ■¼ cup coarsely chopped flat leaf parsley
- ■¼ teaspoon Herbes de Provence
- ■1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 2 anchovy filets packed in oil (drained, chopped)
- 1 or 2 garlic cloves (chopped until smooth)
- •kosher salt
- freshly ground black pepper
 Blend everything in food processor.
 Makes about 1 cup.
